There've been many natural disasters happening throughout the world, haven't there?

Yes. Extreme weather events and natural disasters have claimed so many lives.





Japan also suffers great damage caused by floods, mudslides and earthquakes. So we've got to constantly be thinking about what to do if a natural disaster strikes.

Let's think together today about how to prepare for a natural disaster!





There're three important points when it comes to minimizing or preventing damage caused by a disaster before it happens.

Local residents should help each other out

Be ready to protect you and your family's lives by yourself

Disaster prevention activities sponsored by the fire station, the police and other administrative organizations



Always be prepared with items that can sustain your whole family for about 3 days even if the electricity, gas and water supply get cut off!

Example of things to be prepared at home:

- Water (about 3 liters per person per day)
- **Emergency food**
- Fuel (Portable stove, gas cylinder, etc.)
- Other daily necessities

Example of what to take with you when evacuating:

- ① Valuables ②Emergency food ③Portable radio
- 4 Flashlight 5 First-aid kit 6 Other daily necessities

When disaster occurs, it is also important to understand the right information

Daily life information

The "My Number" system will begin

Foreign residents residing 90 days or longer, or special permanent residents, etc. also will have a "My Number" (personal number).

What is "My Number?"

- O This is a number that all people with a residence card will have.
- O The number is 12 digits. The "My Number" will not change even if your address does.
- The "My Number" is something that will be used indefinitely.
- It will be used for health insurance and tax procedures, etc.




What kind of card is a "notification card?"

 It is a card to notify you of your "My Number" and will be sent to everyone living in Japan <u>from</u>

October through December.

- It is a paper card that will be sent to each family living together at the address listed on your residence card, and will state the name, address, date of birth, gender, and "My Number" for each person.
- It is an important card verifying your "My Number."
 Please don't throw it away by mistake.
- Submit the notification card to the City Hall if your address or name changes.



What kind of card is a "personal number card?"

- It is a card with an IC chip that you can receive if you apply for one.
- It can be used as a personal ID card, just like a residence card or passport.
- It is a card that can verify your "My Number" and your identity.

Japan nationwide census will take place



- The census will examine the date of birth, nationality, etc. of all people living in Japan. It is useful for creating a comfortable living environment for everyone.
- This census will first take place on the Internet.
 People who do not respond via Internet will be given a paper census form and will be asked to fill it in.
- In early September a census representative will come to your house and give you information about how to respond via Internet.
- ② Using a computer or Smart phone, etc. you can respond in Japanese or English via Internet.

- ③ People who do not respond via Internet will be given a paper census form. Fill in the census form and give it to the census representative, or put it in the enclosed envelope and mail it instead. The census form is available in 27 languages, so please tell the census representative which language you prefer.


