For example, in many countries such as Argentina, Greece, and the USA, when people have a sore throat, they put honey or lemon juice in hot tea.

In Hong Kong we put a large amount of ginger in hot cola.



In Brazil we dissolve tapioca powder and make it into soup, adding garlic or other vegetables.

- ① Have resident registration in the city
- ② Don't have a lapse in city tax payments
- ③ Have 1 guarantor with no lapse in city tax payments

- ▽ Selection method: Examination of income status & recommendation statement, etc.
- ▽ Pay back method: Please pay back the loaned money within the two years after the time the school would be set to end if it begins in April, 2016.
- ▽ Application: Available at the Education Planning Division (City Hall 13F), Regional Community Centers, District Citizen's Centers, branch offices, and libraries. Submit the application form and school recommendation statement to the Education Planning Division directly, or send by mail.

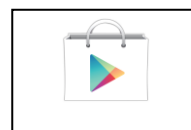
○ App functions

Information on 17 topics such as "Status of residence," "Housing," "Education," "Medical," etc. is clearly explained.

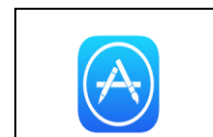
It displays emergency earthquake bulletin sent when an earthquake of magnitude 5 or higher occurs in Japan.
