# Be careful of the simultaneous outbreak of COVID-19 and the flu



It has really become cold recently, hasn't it?

When it gets cold, you're more likely to catch a cold, so you have to be careful.





As for COVID-19, it looks like there may be more people infected this winter than this summer.

Yes, and at the same time, it seems likely that the flu will be prevalent as well.





As we are approaching the New Year holidays, there will be more opportunities for people to gather, so it's important to take basic infection control measures such as washing your hands, ventilating the air, and wearing a mask.

#### Flu Vaccinations

#### ▶What is the flu?

The flue is a viral disease. When a person with the flu coughs or sneezes, the virus spreads through the air, which can then be inhaled and transmitted.

The flu is prevalent from the beginning of winter to the beginning of spring.

You may suddenly develop a high fever and feel pain in your head, joints, or muscles. It can also lead to bronchitis or pneumonia (an illness that makes it difficult to breathe), and the symptoms can become severe (symptoms often get worse).

#### ▶When to get a vaccine

After receiving a vaccine, it takes two weeks for your body to become resistant to the flu.

Also, the effects are said to last for 3 to 5 months. Therefore, it is best to get vaccinated between November and early December, before the flu season hits.

Always call the hospital before going to get a vaccine.

#### Vaccination period in Utsunomiya City:

October 1, 2023 - March 31, 2024

#### 1. Infant vaccination

**▽Target:** Children who are registered as residents in Utsunomiya City and who are 1 year old at the time of vaccination

**∇Subsidy amount:** 1,000 yen per time **∇Number of times:** Up to 2 times per person

2. Vaccinations for the elderly

**▽Target:** The following people ① or ② who have an address registered in Utsunomiya City

- ① 65 years of age or older
- ②People age 60 to 64 with heart, kidney, respiratory, or HIV disorders

**∀Fee to pay by yourself:** 1,500 yen

**∇Number of times:** 1 time. From the second time onward, you will need to pay the full amount yourself.

 $\nabla$ People who are exempt from fees (can receive it for free):

Those who do not have to pay municipal taxes, those receiving public assistance, and Japanese nationals remaining in China can receive a "free ticket" by submitting an "application for self-payment exemption" to the Health Issue Prevention Division in advance.

# Procedures for children of foreign nationalities to attend elementary/junior high school

Children of foreign nationality can also attend elementary school for six years and junior high school for three years.

School begins in April and the first academic year ends in March of the following year. Those who wish to go to school partway through the school year must complete the admission procedures. The municipal elementary/junior high school you attend is determined by your address.

There is also a class for children who are worried about their Japanese reading and writing skills.

If you wish to enroll in a municipal elementary school or junior high school, please contact the School Management Division.



### **David from Paraguay**

We asked David about cultural differences, the San Lorenzo Japanese American Association, life in Japan, and his favorite sports.



Buenas tardes! "Hello" in Spanish

David Hideto Hisaoka is from San Lorenzo, graduated from high school, and came to Japan about a year ago.

**UCIA:** What kind of country is Paraguay?

David: It is a country located almost in the center of South America and has no sea. Soccer is popular. It is famous for South America's largest bird, the Rhea, with a height of about 1.8 meters and weight of about 20kg, resembling an ostrich.

UCIA: What kind of personality do Paraguayans have?

**David**: I like to joke around, and I'm quick to open up conversations with people I meet for the first time.

UCIA: In what ways do you feel cultural differences?

**David:** I want to talk to the Japanese people around me, but they might think it's strange if I suddenly start talking to them. Even if I do, I feel like they won't open up to me.

UCIA: You speak Japanese very well.

David: From the age of 5, I studied Japanese every Saturday at the San Lorenzo Japanese American Association. After making my own "sanshin" (3-stringed instrument) in this group's sanshin class, I learned how to play it. I helped sell drinks during Bon Odori and Japan Festivals. When I attended, I had a chance to speak Japanese.

UCIA: What kind of life do you lead now?

David: I am learning Japanese at a Japanese language school and Japanese language workshops. I hope to pass level 2 of the Japanese Language Proficiency Test. In the future, I would like to pursue economics.

UCIA: What kind of sports do you like?

**David:** I play catcher in baseball and also do triathlons. I love nature, so I made plans to climb Mt. Fuji and even bought some shoes.
