4 habits

Don't smoke when sleeping



Don't put flammable things near heat sources



Stay near open flames when cooking




Keep electrical outlets clean



6 countermeasures

Use stoves and gas burners that have safety devices



Install smoke detectors (devices that sense smoke and heat and sound an alarm) at home ※Check regularly



Use flame-resistant curtains and sheets



Have a fire extinguisher on hand



Elderly and disabled persons should confirm a path of escape ahead of time



Help others living nearby

Be Prepared for Landslide Disasters

If heavy rain or sudden rain continues in the coming season or if a large earthquake occurs, landslide disasters are likely to occur. It is important to have proper knowledge of landslide disasters and always be prepared.

Prepare for landslide disasters by looking at the "Utsunomiya Disaster Prevention Hazard Map" in advance for landslide disaster warning areas (places where it is highly likely for a landslide to occur).

In Utsunomiya City, the "Utsunomiya Disaster Prevention Hazard Map" was distributed to all households in the city in 2024. The hazard map includes disaster prevention information for such disasters as landslides and floods, as well as evacuation plans (escaping to a safe place), and how to prepare in advance to prevent disasters. You can also refer to it on the city's website, so please take a look at it in advance.

○ Always be prepared.

▼ Evacuate as soon as possible.

People living in a landslide disaster warning area should quickly evacuate to a place that is not in a landslide disaster warning area if they sense danger. Also, people living in a place other than a landslide disaster warning area should evacuate immediately if they sense danger.

▼ Think about where to evacuate in advance.

Please consider not only schools, but also friends' or acquaintances' homes in safe places as evacuation locations.

▼ Be careful of where you sleep!

A landslide disaster may occur while you are sleeping. Always sleep in a room on the second floor of a home that is on the valley side and away from a cliff.

▼ Keep a stockpile of home emergency supplies (items always on hand at home) and emergency items (items to be taken with you in the event of evacuation).

Prepare valuables (money, driver's license, etc.), drinking water, food, light source, digital information device (cell phone, charger, etc.), clothing, towels, medical products (medicine), daily life necessities (face wash, dental products), glasses, contact lenses, masks, disinfectant, etc. to sustain you for about three days.

We asked Guillaume of France about French bread, famous people of Orléans, activities in the community, his job, etc.

Bonjour! (Hello in French.)

Guillaume's hometown of Orléans is a sister city of Utsunomiya City, and exchanges between the two cities are flourishing.

UCIA: Is French bread really popular in France?

Guillaume: Traditional French bread is called baguette. Bakeries are open from 6:00AM to 1:00PM. I enjoyed buying fresh bread every morning for breakfast. French people often eat bread, but it is not their staple food, and they also eat it with cheese, etc. for lunch and dinner.

UCIA: Who is a famous person in Orléans?

Guillaume: Jeanne d'Arc is also known as the "Maiden of Orléans," and is famous. He was a soldier and national heroine in the 15th century Kingdom of France. Jeanne d'Arc freed Orléans, so the Jeanne d'Arc festival is held every year on May 8. However, it seems that Jeanne d'Arc stayed in Orléans only for one night.

UCIA: Is there anything you are making a special effort on raising your children?

Guillaume: I read French picture books to my children and speak French to them at home. I tell them to speak Japanese when they are out and about so that they do not come across as being rude. At such times, my children sometimes correct my Japanese

and it makes me think that "Japanese is more native to my children!"

UCIA: What kind of activities are you doing in the community?

Guillaume: In the area where I live, one person from each household is supposed to be a member of the fire department. When there is fire department training, I participate in the "morning training" from 5:00AM to 6:30AM three times a week. I'm learning how to help other people in case of a disaster. It is early in the morning, but I am enjoying it. I am able to form deep bonds with my neighbors.

UCIA: What kind of work are you doing?

Guillaume: I am running the Chazal French School and teaching French. I also teach at high schools and universities. I make any effort to provide fun classes by teaching not only the language, but also about French culture, customs, and recent events.

UCIA: Is there something you are hoping to do in the future?

Guillaume: I like mechanics, so I hope to be able to repair motorcycles. It would be nice if I could participate in a circuit race.
